Largest Ever Exhibit of Stuart Figures Outside Ventura Could Open Six-Month Runs in December 2011 and 2012

The Foundation vision to promote travelling exhibits was given a big boost when the Clinton Library curator contacted HFF in January about an exhibit of Historical Figures. Thanks to Stuart supporter Deborah Carroll of Hot Springs, the Clinton Staff had seen the MVC booklet and had studied the HFF website. In late April, HFF supporters Leroy and Ria Becker, drove Lincoln Era Figures across country to meeting with Library officials.

The Clinton Library could be the first of many presidential sites to feature the art and history of George Stuart. After presenting the "American Treasures" in Little Rock, the Beckers drove to the George H. W. Bush Presidential Library in College Station, TX where the Figures were received enthusiastically.

At this time, MVC is negotiating with the Clinton and Bush Libraries to loan about 45 American Patriots & Founders and Lincoln Era Figures for exhibits in 2011 and 2012.

George Stuart and his Historical Figures would feel right at home in a presidential library, where history and art are equally welcome. The Figures loaned from the collections of Mr. Stuart and MVC cover the two great wars fought on U. S. soil.

The Foundation proposes to place the Figures in historical context with several educational programs, including printed and audio gallery guides featuring commentary by Mr. Stuart. In addition, Mr. Stuart will most likely give three performances during opening week. The education specialists at the Clinton Museum regularly design special learning materials and games for young visitors. It will be interesting to see what they create with the Figures and their unique history.

MVC staff will coordinate the loan of the Figures, while Mr. Stuart and HFF volunteers will develop the print and audio guides.





Foundation Projects

Three New Figure Groups Added to Digital Image Library

The Digital Image Library is on schedule for completion this year, thanks to contributions from HFF members and a grant from the Smith-Hobson Foundation. In recent months, Figures of the **Lincoln Era, the Renaissance and Reformation and the Movement West** have been added to the library database.

These new additions take the library to over 300 Figures, with only two groups remaining to be photographed—the Naples Museum's Collection of French Figures and Mr. Stuart's Germanic Legend & Myth Collection.

The new images are already playing important roles in HFF and MVC activities. In March and April, the new groups were published on the HFF website at www.galleryhistoricalfigures.com.

New photography of Martin Luther and Charles V helped promote the current monolog performances and many Reformation Figures were incorporated in Mr. Stuart's PowerPoint presentation.



New Tucson Miniatures Museum May Host Historical Figures Exhibit

The Mini-Time Machine in Tucson, AZ was created from the imagination and dedication of Founders, Patricia and Walter Arnell. A life-long collector, Ms. Arnell has a fondness for miniatures, especially antique doll houses and collectables.

The Time Machine staff were fascinated by the three Historical Figures displayed by the Foundation team. Soon ideas flew about how to exhibit them.

Because of the Spanish influence on the history of the area, thoughts turned to the Movement West Collection, especially Father Kino, a local hero.

Father Eubesio Kino, the Austrian Jesuit was dauntless in his travels through the barren deserts of the Sonora and Baja regions of Mexico. His maps and charts were used through the 19th century, and his missions stand today. It is believed that he introduced cattle ranching to the west.*
