Carnevale Ventura takes its inspiration from the life-like Renaissance figures of world renowned

artist/monologist George Stuart and the Carnevale di Venezia (circa the twelfth century and ongoing). The Ventura festival's theme highlights the Borgias, the subject of recent television dramas. Life-size re-creations of Mr. Stuart's popular Historical Figures from that infamous family, rendered by talented

local artisans, will make appearances throughout. As a lead-in to the much-anticipated Carnevale, the Designers Fashion Show and Marketplace, according to Mr. Stuart, serves as "an educational and entertaining opportunity to demonstrate what can be done with this exotic theme. Professionals and amateurs alike will share their enthusiasm and skills and help focus all participants on that time from the past. What a sumptuous occasion this will be!"

The Designers Fashion Show takes place in the Crowne Plaza Grand Ballroom, with the Costume Marketplace of imagination and instruction on the lobby level. Renaissance and Venetian style designers, hairstyle and makeup experts, mask makers, and vendors of everything from jewelry to swords will cover every costuming need and budget. Individuals come away with personalized advice and assistance to fulfill head-to-toe festival wear desires.

Carnevale Ventura event coordinator Angel Jones, owner of the Wenches and Warlocks costume shop, encourages prize-worthy artistic creations made to elicit ooohs and huzzahs. "What is that sword, amulet or hat that brings you into that world at that time?" she asks. "We want everyone to take that step that makes you part of the event, whether it's a high-end authentic costume, something edgy, a modern take on grandiose Venetian style, a fantasy design, or simply a creative mask. In the VIP Lounge, Designer Fashion Show VIP ticket holders can indulge in Italian coffees, teas and treats, and grab a libation at the hosted bar to raise a cheer.
